These positions integrate the roles of teacher, researcher and scholarly practitioner within the Occupational Therapy program and provides opportunity for inter-professional collaboration across an array of health care professions. The ideal candidates will have experience as a teacher, researcher and practitioner in the field of Occupational Therapy. Successful candidates will also participate fully in the life of the university, activities of the department, Lewis School of Nursing and Health Professions, and continued development and accreditation of the program.

Applicants who hold a doctoral-level degree or equivalent doctoral degree with an established record of research and scholarly productivity, demonstrated clinical experience and a commitment to excellence in graduate-level teaching are preferred. Minimum requirements include: doctoral degree in occupational therapy or related field, at least 5 years of clinical practice as an occupational therapist, NBCOT certification and eligible to practice OT in the State of Georgia, evidence of scholarly activity, experience or demonstrated potential for advising and mentoring students.
